



### What do the Fathers Say?






### Who Established this Sacrament?








"...the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you do this in remembrance of 1 Cor 11:23-24





"In the same manner he also took the cup after supper, saying "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me" 1 Cor 11:25

- 26:26 "And as they were eating,
  Jesus took bread, blessed and broke
  it, and gave it to the disciples and
  said, Take, eat; this is My body.
- 26:27 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink from it, all of you.
- 26:28 For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins." Mt 26:26-28



1. True Body/Blood of the Lord


 I am the living bread which came down from heaven" John 6:51

 "He who eats my flesh and drinks My blood abides in me, and I in him." John 6:56






• "For we, being many, are one bread and one body; for we all partake of that one bread" 1 Cor 10:17




5. Remission of My Sins

How should we approach Holy Communion?




#### 1 Corinthians 11:27-31




#### Meaning of Worthiness


- 1. With Faith: No doubt concerning the bread & wine being the true Body/Blood of the Lord (Faith)

- 3. With Reconciliation: Reconciled with others Mt 5:23-24


### Matthew 5:23-24




